Today is the Third Sunday of Advent. Advent is a four-week period of preparation for Christmas. In a spirit of expectation and repentance, we look back to the time before Christ's coming in Bethlehem and look forward to his coming again in glory. It is important that we turn from our sins and prepare to stand before his glorious throne of judgment. Today is traditionally also called **Rose Sunday or Gaudete Sunday (Latin for "Rejoice")**, and marks that we are over halfway through the season.

Cantor Say to them that are of a fearful heart: Be strong, fear not; behold, your God will come and save you.

All baptized Christians who have been admitted to Holy Communion, are repentant of their sins, and believe in the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament are welcome to receive Communion. Anglicans receive on the tongue or in the right hand palm, and by guiding the chalice to their lips. If you do not intend to receive, you may instead come up for a blessing—simply cross your arms over your chest.

After receiving Communion or a blessing at the altar rail, parents may bring their children through the west side aisle to the Library for Sunday School.
