The Solemnity of All Saints

8:30a Low Mass and 10:30a Sung Mass

We welcome all who may be visitors this morning, and we hope you will come again to worship God here with us.

Today is the Solemnity of All Saints, commonly called All Saints Sunday. All Saints is one of the feasts with an eight-day (Octave) celebration. The Solemnity is the Sunday within that Octave. The eighth day is commemorated as the Saints and Martyrs of the Anglican Communion.

All baptized Christians who have been admitted to Holy Communion, are repentant of their sins, and believe in the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament are welcome to receive Communion. Reception of the host will be in the right hand palm only today. If you do not intend to receive, you may instead come up for a blessing—simply cross your arms over your chest.

After receiving Communion or a blessing at the altar rail, parents may bring their children through the west side aisle to the Library for Sunday School.
