FROM THE RECTOR

St. Paul's Family,

As we draw closer to Holy Week and the sacred Triduum, I pray you will consciously enter into the acts of devotion during this most sacred time of year. It is a good time to make a full examination of our lives and see where we can make spiritual improvement as well as improve our own temperament and living. Just as those who were set apart from the church were welcomed back at Easter after a season of fasting and penance, let us with solemnity meditate upon the saving acts of our Lord, and enter with joy into his resurrection.

St. Anselm of Canterbury, in his Proslogion, writes:

Up now, slight man! flee, for a little while, your occupations; hide yourself, for a time, from your disturbing thoughts. Cast aside, now, your burdensome cares, and put away your toilsome business. Yield room for some little time to God; and rest for a little time in him. Enter the inner chamber of your mind; shut out all thoughts save that of God, and such as can aid you in seeking him; close your door and seek him. Speak now, my whole heart! Speak now to God, saying, I seek your face; your face, Lord, will I seek. And come you now, O Lord my God, teach my heart where and how it may seek you, where and how it may find you.

Let us take Anselm's words to heart and beseech God to teach our hearts how to seek Him and where to find Him as we prepare to enter into this sacred time.

Flowers are \$50 for 2 Vases, the High Altar Sanctuary Lamp is \$5, and the Chapel Shrine Lamp is \$5. The cost may be split among several people.
