<i>All baptized Christians who have been admitted to Holy Communion, are repentant of their sins, and believe in the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament are welcome to receive Communion. Anglicans receive on the tongue or in the right hand palm, and by guiding the chalice to their lips. If you do not intend to receive, you may instead come up for a blessing—simply cross your arms over your chest.</i>		
<i>After receiving Communion or a blessing at the altar rail, parents may bring their children through the west side aisle to the Library for Sunday School.</i>
