Communion (*sit*)

Cantor He that eateth my Flesh, and drinketh my Blood: dwelleth in me, and I in him.

All baptized Christians who have been admitted to Holy Communion, are repentant of their sins, and believe in the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament are welcome to receive Communion. Holy Communion may be received in one of three ways. 1) You may receive the host only on your tongue or in your hands, and return to your seat after you consume the host. 2) You may consume the host and sip from the chalice and then return to your seat. 3) When the bishop/priest comes to you, you may ask to have the host intincted/ dipped in the wine and then have it placed on your tongue. Self-intinction is not permitted. If you are re not baptized, or unable to receive holy communion, please feel free to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest, and the presider will pronounce a blessing upon you.
