Liturgical Notes

Most hymns are from the blue 1940 Hymnal in the pew rack, and please note that hymn numbers are not necessarily page numbers. If the hymn number is preceded by the letter 'L,' then the hymn is from the "Lift Every Voice" hymn book on the pew seat.

If kneeling or standing is not possible for you, you may remain seated. And finally, a friendly reminder to please be aware of personal belongings while at church—we recommend you not bring valuables to church and that you never leave your purse or such unattended.
